Background

Pathfinder International launched the *Naya Qadam* (A new dawn in English) project in Pakistan in Sindh and Punjab in 2018 with funding from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. The consortium consisted of partners Greenstar Social Marketing, National Committee on Maternal and Neonatal Health (NCMNH), Aahung, Shirkat Gah and IPAS, and was conducted in partnership with the Government of Sindh and Punjab.

- Capacity building of HCPs and Outreach workers/volunteers
- <u>Complete ownership of the government of NQ interventions</u>
- Project was <u>able to bring community's voice in planning and implementation</u> with extensive engagement of youth champions, male allies and CBOs
